This tax organizer is designed to help you gather the tax information to prepare your 2022 personal income tax return. To assist with this process, we are providing the following checklist:

MANDATORY

Please check off when completed and return to Laurel Accounting & Tax with your tax information.

I have completed and included the Mandatory Questionnaire.

I have completed the Direct Deposit / Electronic Funds Withdrawal page. If I want any refunds direct deposited or taxes due paid directly from my bank account, I have included a copy of a voided check.

I have reviewed, signed and included the Engagement Letter.

I have completed and included the Credit Questionnaire, *if applicable*.

I have completed the Tax Questionnaire and reviewed the information in the Tax Organizer pages. If any information does not apply or is incorrect, please note the changes and return to us.

FEES

We have implemented a minimum fee of \$400 for preparation of personal income tax returns. Our regular hourly rates are \$125 - \$225 per hour.

HOW TO SEND INFORMATION TO US

As always, do not text or e-mail confidential information.

HOW WE SEND INFORMATION TO YOU

Electronic - By default we will send you an electronic copy of your tax return by e-mail, protected by SafeSend, and e-file all returns whenever possible. Signatures will be collected electronically using E-Sign services. It is very important that we have a correct individual e-mail address on file for all tax return signers.

Paper - We will mail your tax return to you via USPS Priority Mail, which provides package tracking. **Additional fees** of \$40 (or more for larger returns) will apply. Please check below if you prefer a paper copy of your return(s).

- *I prefer to receive a paper copy of my tax return. I understand additional fees will apply.*

You will also need to provide the following information:

- Forms W-2 for wages, salaries, and tips.
- All Forms 1099 for interest, dividends, retirement, miscellaneous income, unemployment compensation, nonemployee compensation, Social Security, state or local refunds, gambling winnings, etc.
- Brokerage statements showing investment transactions for stocks, bonds, virtual currencies, etc.
- Schedule K-1 showing income from partnerships, S corporations, estates, and trusts.
- Statements and receipts supporting qualified educational expenses, deductions, or distributions, including any Forms 1098-T, 1098-E, or 1099-Q.
- All Forms 1095-A, 1095-B, and/or 1095-C related to health care coverage or the Premium Tax Credit.
- All Forms 1099-QA and/or 5498-QA related to ABLE (Achieving a Better Life Experience) account.
- All Forms 1099-H related to Health Coverage Tax Credit (HCTC) advance payments.
- Statements supporting deductions for mortgage interest (Forms 1098), taxes, and charitable contributions (including any Form 1098-C).
- Copies of closing statements regarding the sale or purchase of real property.
- Legal papers for adoption, divorce, or separation involving custody of your dependent children.
- Six-digit Identity Protection PIN if sent to you by the IRS.
- Any tax notices sent to you by the IRS or other taxing authority.

In order to meet the filing deadline for your 2022 income tax return, your completed tax organizer needs to be received by our office no later than March 24, 2023. Any information received after that date may require an extension of time be filed for your return.

You have the final responsibility for the income tax returns and, therefore, you should review them carefully before you sign them.

Our work in connection with the preparation of your income tax returns does not include any procedures designed to discover defalcations and/or irregularities, should any exist. We will render such accounting and bookkeeping assistance as determined to be necessary for preparation of the income tax returns.

The law provides various penalties that may be imposed when taxpayers understate their tax liability. If you would like information on the amount or the circumstances of these penalties, please contact us.

Your returns may be selected for review by the taxing authorities. Any proposed adjustments by the examining agent are subject to certain rights of appeal.
